A Word from Pastor Drew Thoughts on Receiving a Gift Luke 2:1-20

"Nothing is more repugnant to capable, reasonable people than grace."

You know who said that? John Wesley said that. Having himself held out against grace for a number of years, (even as he was preaching its merits to others), he knew whereof he spoke.

We like to think that we are the ones in control ... that we are not dependent on anyone, even God. And so ... into all of this, we Christians introduce a story. It is a simple story about a God who wanted to do something for <u>us</u>.... Something so strange and so outside the scope of ordinary imagination.... Something so beyond what we could conceivably do for ourselves.... That God resorted to angels, pregnant teenagers, and stars in the sky to get it done.

And whatever you think about the details of the story, remember that their purpose is to show us that Christmas is not something we can do for ourselves, but something that God does for us. The details of Luke's timeless story strike the mind as "extraordinary," precisely so that we will not view what they represent as "ordinary." "For unto us a son is given." All we can do at Bethlehem is receive him.

We need the nativity stories. We need their quietness ... their passivity. Because we need to allow the God of these stories to give us an unexpected gift. Somewhere, somehow, somebody has to train us to be receivers. We don't know how to receive gifts very well. We see most gifts as having not only bows, but strings attached. Every gift comes with a claim. And we're not ready to be claimed.

Well friends, I've got to tell you. God's goal (in giving you his gift) is to claim you....to lure you into a relationship....to draw you closer....to suck you in....to cut through your defenses with something that will be incredibly hard to resist. This gift, this divine gift, comes as a baby. That's right, a baby. Love is a baby, Who, in his infancy, in his helplessness, will ask more of us than he will bring to us. All babies do, at first. Because, in the short run, we will have to take care of him....he, who in the eternal scheme of things, was born to take care of us.

I retired in 2008, and miraculously that same year, a "part-time" job became available at Forest Heights. I have been at Forest Heights for 16 years and have witnessed many changes.

My spiritual growth since I've been at Forest Heights has been phenomenal. Currently, I feel the spirit moving through our church constantly, as many activities are being initiated and "re-booted" by the PEOPLE! It is a wonderful thing to witness. My own faith journey has expanded so much since I've been here, not only through the music ministry, but also through our empathetic and thoughtprovoking pastors.

I would be remiss if I did not mention one person – Sue Wyatt. She was the 1st person I met other than the pastor, and from Day One, she became my mentor and dear friend. She taught me to be aware of God through ordinary events, not to think of them as just coincidences.

I will end with some miscellaneous items. I am left-handed. However, I knit and play guitar right-handed. I love animals. My favorites are dogs and turtles. I've had dogs my whole life. I currently have 2 senior rescue fur babies – Tessa (blind, liver disease) and Mimi (deaf).


