A Word from Pastor Drew

HE WAS BRILLIANT. Clearly a child prodigy, the pride of Salzburg, a performer par excellence. One of the most brilliant and gifted composers of all time left earth at the young age of thirty-five. The man lived most of his life in abject poverty. He died in complete obscurity!

His official name was Johannes Chrysostomus Wolfgang Amadeus Theophilus Mozart. With a handle like that, he *had* to be famous. We call him *Mozart.*

What lives on are Mozart's *unique contributions*: his style, his eminent innovations, the inimitable "Mozart touch." No other musical sound is like it. It is his, altogether. A *timeless trophy,* created by a genius, captured on the score, bringing warmth and delight to endless generations. In his music, Mozart lives on. Unexcelled.

God's Word speaks of this solemn reality: How do you know what your life will be like tomorrow? "Your life is like the morning fog – it's here a little while, then it's gone. What you ought to say is, "If the Lord want us to, we will live and do this or that." (James 4:14-16) Otherwise, you are boasting about you own pretentious plans, and all such boasting is evil.

What do we learn from this? First, *life is brief.* On most grave markers, there is a little horizontal line illustrating a lifespan. Mozart's stone reads: "1756 – 1791." That's it. If only that "dash" could speak.

Second, *opportunity is now.* Not later. Your contribution, though small, is uniquely yours – a timeless trophy you invest daily.

Third, *death is sure*. You can't escape it. It's coming, friend. And at that time, like Mozart, you may seem insignificant to others. Forgotten, even. The only thing that will live on will be your personal contributions, your unique lifetime investments. You cannot presume on tomorrow. It may not come. You have only today.

Turn to the Lord today and commit your time, gifts, affections, and investments to Him. Make certain His name is made known and His grace transferred through your brief, but meaningful years on earth. Think of your life as a timeless trophy of His goodness to future generations.

Ms. Ida has been homebound for many years but stays connected through letters, cards, and the telephone. Many of you have received a warm, welcoming call from Ida when you came to Forest Heights. She has the last three editions of our church directory sitting by her recliner. Ida is the last surviving member of what I lovingly call the Three Musketeers – Ida, her sister Rosalina, and her brother-in-law, Tim. Where one member

Ida was born, raised, and educated in the Philippines. She later moved to Hawaii and finally to Tennessee to join her sister, Rosalina. Her career background was that of a hospice social worker. She said that serving others was modeled in her family. – her father was a pastor in the Evangelical Christian Church. Church was always an important part of her life. She grew up knowing that God loved her and walking in His path came naturally to her.

Ida attended the Philippians Wesleyan College and the University of Tennessee School of Social Work. She holds three bachelor's degrees – a Bachelor of Arts, a Bachelor of Science in Education, and a Bachelor of Science in Social Work. Ida started working with Hospice of West Tennessee in 1989 and immediately felt at home. She enjoyed the loving, caring, and supportive environment. She built a strong relationship with her patients and their families. In 2004 the Jackson Sun did a Community Profile on Ms. Ida, calling her "an angel in a a hula shirt" (referring to the time she lived in Hawaii). Ida enjoyed working with Camp Bluebird, sponsored by West Tennessee Healthcare, for cancer patients.

After visiting at Forest Heights, she knew immediately that this is where her church home should be. For many years she was active in the Methodist Women, the knitting circle, helped with the Bazaar, and with Ann Shaw's encouragement, Ida helped on a Habitat for Humanity house.

Perhaps one of Ms. Ida's greatest spiritual gifts is one of hospitality and encouragement. She has never met a stranger and has a remarkable recall of names and faces. Once you meet Ida, you will be friends for life
